## Occupational Therapist

### Description

The Occupational Therapist will assess and treat LWDH Inpatients with physical and cognitive impairments, utilizing a variety of skills and resources, including but not limited to splinting, wheelchair assessment and prescription, relevant outcome measures and tests and self-care activities, to increase patient functional capacity and independence.

The Occupational Therapist helps patients regain independence by teaching them safer ways to perform daily activities. They also address equipment needs, such as wheelchairs and special utensils, and treat cognitive difficulties like memory and problem-solving skills.

LWDH offers Inpatient Occupational Therapy is available Monday to Friday from 8 am to 4 pm. We also offer community-based OT services available for stroke rehabilitation and for individuals at risk of hospital admission or readmission, with the goal of helping them return to or remain in their homes.

### Qualifications

- Must be a member in good standing with the College of OT of Ontario
- Must be a graduate of a certified and accredited University with a Bachelor or Master's degree in OT
- Previous experience in physical medicine preferred
- Authorizer status for ADP mobility devices preferred
- Effective interpersonal and communication skills and ability to work effectively in a team environment
- Current certification in BCLS and demonstrated ongoing competence through annual re-certification
- Demonstrated knowledge of computers and Windows-based software programs/keyboarding skills
- Familiarity with all Occupational Therapy equipment and supplies, and ability to coordinate management and maintenance of Occupational therapy equipment and supplies
- Independent clinical problem-solving skills, ability to organize and prioritize work within time constraints, and demonstrated sound judgment, and initiative
- Demonstrated ability to effectively perform physical Medicine Occupational Therapy assessments and analyses, and to coordinate implementation of prioritized OT interventions utilizing available supports including family, staff and students.
- Physically capable of frequent bending, stretching, and lifting and of assisting heavy-needs patients with bed mobility, transfers, ambulation, and exercise program. Must be able to stand and walk the major portion of the day
- Demonstrated record of good performance, punctuality and reliable attendance record.
- Must demonstrate a tactful, empathetic, and caring patient approach, and encourage independence
- Demonstrated ability to prioritize duties/projects, multi-task, and work independently in a fast-paced environment with constant demands
